Cyrus Wakefield, a groceryman of No. 229 Laurel Avenue, Twentieth Ward, died at the Memorial Hospital this morning at 2 o'clock after a brief illness from dysentery, followed by an attack of heart trouble. Mr. Wakefield took sick with a chill Tuesday morning of last week, but was not removed to the hospital until last evening, and his death was unexpected to his family and friends.

The deceased was born in Brushvalley Township, Indiana County, about fifty-eight years ago and removed to Johnstown a couple of years before the Flood of 1889. He had been in the grocery business for some twelve years. His wife who was Mary Angeline Cramer, died five years ago and the following children survive: Lawrence F., of Pitcairn; Carrie, wife of James Jones of Garfield street; Irvin, at home; Bertha, wife of Lawrence Timmony, of Garfield street; Grace, at home. The funeral will probably be held Saturday afternoon, with interment in Grand View Cemetery.

Mary Angeline, wife of Cyrus Wakefield, the bling merchant of Morrellville, died at her home on Laurel avenue, Twentieth Ward, at 2:30 o'clock yesterday morning. She was aged forty-eight years and eight days and had been ill for eleven weeks. Mrs. Wakefield was born in Brushvalley Township, Indiana County, her maiden name being Cramer. She was a devoted wife and a loving mother, and her loss is mourned by her husband and the following children:

Lawrence, of Pitcairn, Allegheny County, and Carrie, Irvin, Bertha, and Grace, all at home. The deceased had been a member of the Morrellville Methodist Church for many years.

The funeral will take place tomorrow afternoon from the late home of the deceased. Rev. NB. Tannehill, of the Morrellville M. E. Church, will conduct the obsequies, after which interment will be made in Grand View Cemetery.
